The Spirit of Giving Canned Food Challenge - WE CAN DO IT!

There is a special buzz around the school that our very own Sam Catherall has surpassed the 2,582 pounds of food that he brought in for Northwest Harvest last year. **If one young man can alone bring in this much food, we certainly can reach our goal of 3,000 pounds as a school.** In 2016, 1 in 8 people from Washington did not get enough food to meet their nutritional needs, 1 in 6 rely on their local food banks, and 1 in 5 children live in a household that struggles to put food on the table. If all O'Dea students bring in just SIX pounds of food, we will exceed the goal of 3,000 pounds and will be victorious in The Sam Catherall Canned Food Challenge and Principal Walker will alter our school schedule on a future date to become a Minimum Day schedule with a relaxed dress code. So far we have brought in 1,344 pounds of food (44% of our goal) and the Limerick House is in the lead with 403 pounds. **If Sam can bring in this much alone, we can do this together!** Please bring in your donations to Mentor Group by Tuesday, November 21st.
