#### Leadership from the Heart

Have you had a parent, a teacher, or a friend, who could encourage you, console you, be open-hearted toward you whenever you needed. We had a friend just like that. His name was Joshua King. We lost our friend in 1997, just 8 years after he graduated from O'Dea but we remember the impact he had on us through this award.

Josh grew up in Seattle. He was the oldest of 3 and attended Blessed Sacrament school. At O'Dea, Josh was a varsity athlete and student body officer. He received the Most Inspirational Award from the O'Dea football team his senior year.

After O'Dea, Josh was a college student, a cook, a caregiver, and a firefighter in training. We lost Josh before we could see him fulfill his life's ambitions but not before he could change our lives with his encouragement, friendship, compassion, and loyalty.

#### About the Award

The Joshua King Leadership Award is created with the belief that there is no one style of leadership. This award is for all emerging leaders at O'Dea who seek an opportunity to develop their leadership skills in order to serve their school and community.

Each Spring, a new freshman is selected for the award, which provides \$3,000 per year for his remaining three years at O'Dea. The aim is to encourage young men at O'Dea to rise to their potential, grow as leaders and exemplify service to others.

The successful applicant will be looking to develop the following qualities:

- Leadership -you want to be actively involved at O'Dea and within your community
- **Social Justice** you want a more just society and are developing your awareness of local, national and global issues
- **Influence** you want to have a positive influence on your friends and community and you want effective communication skills to influence change

# The Joshua King Leadership Award Application



## Overview

The Joshua King Leadership Award is a 3 year, \$3,000/year award supporting students committed to:

- **Leadership** Candidates must demonstrate leadership through school activities, public service and/or community involvement.
- **Social Justice** Applicants must demonstrate a commitment to justice and the well-being of others through service to their communities and by cultivating an awareness of local, national and global issues.
- Able to influence others & challenge themselves Candidates should possess well-
- developed written and oral communication skills. Applicants should be challenging themselves in the classroom.

## **Application Directions**

To apply, the following completed documents must be postmarked or delivered to the O'Dea High School Principal's Office on or before February 1, 2017:

- 1. Joshua King Leadership Award Application
- 2. Leadership Resume & Personal Statement
- 3. One letter of recommendation from a teacher, church/community member, or adult who can attest to your experiences in service and leadership.

## Application Deadline

The deadline for receipt of applications materials is February 1, 2017.


## **Expectations for Award Winners**

Recipients are expected to:

- 1. Assume leadership and service roles on campus, in the classroom, or within the community
- 2. Participate in gatherings with other King Leadership Award recipients, the King family and scholarship supporters, including an annual leadership event
- 3. Submit a request for funding each Spring of their Sophomore and Junior years to renew the award.
- 4. Continue to challenge themselves inside the classroom

## Joshua King Leadership Day - February 24, 2017

After reviewing the students' applications the selection committee will invite finalists to gather on campus to consider an important topic. Applicants will give brief oral presentations based upon an assigned reading and will be interviewed by committee members. One student will be selected from this group to receive the Joshua King Leadership Award. The recipient will be notified in mid-March. Finalists will be recognized for their participation in the competition.
