POSITION: School Counselor for the 2018-2019 school year

- The School Counselor is a member of the Counseling Department and the Faculty
- The School Counselor position is responsible for providing a comprehensive counseling program
 for students which integrates services that meet the individual student's needs. This would also
 include consultation with teachers, staff, other high school educational programs and parents to
 enhance the counselor role as the student advocate for achievement of academic, social and
 college/career success.

JOB DESCRIPTION

- 1. Provide individual counseling
 - a. Academic Planning and Counseling
 - b. College/Career Counseling
 - c. Personal/Social counseling
 - d. Refer students with serious problems to appropriate program specialists or community agencies
 - e. Engage the student's parents/guardians throughout each school year in discussions about the student's academic, college/career and social progress
 - f. Maintain a confidential file on each student that documents all interactions with both the student and his parents/guardians
- 2. Provide Small Group Counseling in identified areas of common concern
- 3. Develop and Implement a school counseling curriculum

- a. Grade level appropriate
- b. Collaborate with school and community resources
- c. Articulate the curriculum to students, parents, faculty/staff and the community
- d. Review the curriculum annually in consultation with the Assistant Principal for Student Services
- 4. Collect and interpret a variety of data, provide reports for administrative purposes
- 5. Attend or participate in all required staff meetings and other activities deemed necessary by school administrators, in order to accomplish the objectives of the position, for professional achievement, and as part of a process of continual improvement and growth.

- WA State ESA certification as a school counselor
- Masters Degree in School Counseling
- Experience working with the academic, social, and emotional needs of high school age boys and parents in a high school setting is required.
- Experience working with a diverse student and parent population
- Ability to effectively handle challenging and sensitive situations with students, parents, faculty/staff and administrators
- Demonstrated ability to exercise sound judgment and decision making.
- Experience with student and parent programming and informational sessions.
- Experience with individual and group counseling sessions
- Ability to prioritize and manage multiple tasks
- Excellent organization, written and oral communication skills.
