Academics & Counseling Student Assistance Program

In an effort to provide another avenue of support for our students, the O'Dea Counseling Department has developed a Student Assistance Program. We have designed this program so that students can anonymously report when they are concerned about another O'Dea student. When a report is made during school hours, a counselor is notified immediately. The counseling team then determines the appropriate action to be taken for the student of concern. PSAT Testing Day

O'Dea High School will be administering the Preliminary SAT (PSAT) to all Freshmen, Sophomores and Juniors on Wednesday, October 10th at 8:10AM. Students should report to their G1 classes in normal school attire at 8:10AM and will be dismissed at 11:45AM. This exam provides firsthand practice for the SAT Test and gives students a comprehensive analysis of their answers. This exam also generates free, personalized SAT Practice on Khan Academy to help strengthen their SAT performance, and gives Juniors a chance to enter National Merit Scholarship Corporation scholarship programs. **Seniors do not have classes that day and should spend time working on their college applications.**

College Application Drop In

On Wednesday, October 10th, the counseling department will be offering assistance to all seniors who want help completing their college applications. Drop by Room 100 any time between 9am and 11:30am and there will be counselors there to work with you on your applications.

Academic Resources through Seattle Public Library

O'Dea's Surface Program has opened new opportunities to educate students on how to research and access free academic resources through Seattle's Public Library. All students of O'Dea, even those who reside outside of the city limits, are eligible to receive these library cards. ACE Mentors

Is your son interested in Architecture, Construction or Engineering? ACE Mentors is a free after-school program which pairs high school students with professional mentors from the building industry. During the meetings – held once every two weeks during the school year – he will participate with other students and mentors in activities from site visits to actually designing a unique building project. Meetings are typically held from 4-6pm at the offices of your son's mentors. The program runs from the beginning of November through May and is open to students in grades 9-12. At the end of the year, your son's team will have the opportunity to present his project to other teams, mentors, professionals, and parents. Seniors in the program are also eligible to apply for scholarships. Last year 15 students received a total of nearly **\$90,000** in scholarships in the ACE Washington chapter. Non-seniors have the opportunity to apply for an all-expenses-paid trip to the ACE Summer Camp in Colorado. Click <u>HERE</u> to sign up by Friday, October 12th.
