Greg Brashear '64

Greg Brashear began his 30-year career with the Seattle School District at Garfield. His girls' teams won eight State Championships, five of which were consecutive in 1981-85, and finished in second place in 1986 by only one point. Under his direction, Garfield won numerous league titles and was always considered a contender for the State Championship. Throughout his 30 years of coaching, Greg coached 38 individual Champions. Greg was named Girls Track Coach of the Year by the Washington State Track and Field Coaches Association in 1997. He was the 2001 KingCo Coach of the Year and was inducted into the Washington State Track and Field Coaches Hall of Fame in 2003.

Jamelle McMillan '07

Jamelle McMillan was a part of three O'Dea State Championship basketball teams ('04, '05 & '07), appearing in four Title games for the Fighting Irish. He was ranked, "Top Point Guard on the West Coast," by Rivals after his senior season, in which he was named, "Gatorade Player of the Year," for the state of Washington. McMillan was given the "Best Defender Award" by Rivals Recruiting, in its "Best of the Pac-10" for his recruiting class. He attended Arizona State University and was a team captain for the Sun Devils. He was part of a trio of 2010-11 seniors who were first in Sun Devils history to record 80 wins over the course of their playing careers. McMillan led the Pac-10 in assist-to-turnover ratio as a senior, finishing 14th nationally. After his time at ASU, Jamelle served as Director of Basketball Operations at Drake University, followed by coaching in the NBA for the New Orleans Pelicans, Phoenix Suns and Atlanta Hawks.

Mike Crotty

Mike Crotty is a 1968 graduate from Glacier High School in Burien, WA and holds a Bachelor's in Business Administration from the University of Notre Dame. At Glacier, Mike was an all-around, three-sport athlete. In basketball, he was a 3-year starter, 2-year captain, and named All North Puget Sound League 1st Team Guard his junior and senior years. In football, he was a 3-year starter, and named 1st Team All North Puget Sound League Defensive Back his junior year and 1st Team All Puget League Defensive Back and Running Back his senior year. During his senior year in baseball, he was captain and named to the 1st Team All North Puget Sound League at second base. At the University of Notre Dame, he was a 3-year Letterman, back up Running Back his sophomore year, and 2-year starter at Free Safety his junior and senior years. During those two years, he recorded 142 tackles, 13 pass deflections, 4 interceptions, and 4 fumble recoveries. At the completion of his college career, Mike was selected to play Free Safety for the North team in the Lions All America Bowl Game. Mike has been a Coach at O'Dea High School since 1992, coaching running backs and defensive backs. He has served as the Offensive Coordinator, Defensive Coordinator, and Assistant Head Coach. He has coached three of O'Dea's State Championship Teams and has been named Assistant Coach of the Year three times by the WIAA.

Mike Doyle '97

Mike Doyle is a proud member of the O'Dea class of 1997 and a graduate of Gonzaga University in Spokane, WA. In 2007 Doyle joined the O'Dea faculty Social Studies Department and was named Head Coach of the Baseball team after coaching as an assistant in the program since 2002. During his 14-year tenure as Head Coach, the Irish have accumulated 207 wins, four Metro League Titles, a 19 – 7 overall state tournament record, and three State Championships ('09, '10 and '14). As of 2021 he has also coached 37 future collegiate baseball players during this period. The success of the Irish Baseball team has earned Coach Doyle recognition by the Metro League in 2009, the WSBCA in 2010 and the NBUA in 2015 as their Coach of the Year, recognizing the efforts of the strongest coaching staff in the state.
