

Craig Richardson '82

Craig Richardson is a proud member of the O'Dea class of 1982 and a graduate of Eastern Washington University. While at O'Dea, Craig earned a total of six letters in football, basketball, baseball, and track. During his Senior year, he competed in the State High School Track & Field AA Championships in the 100M and 200M races.

After leaving O'Dea, Craig was a productive receiver and record setting kick returner as a four-year starter at Eastern Washington University. He tied the NCAA Division I-AA record with a career 27.2-yard kickoff return average on 80 run backs. In 1984, he returned twenty-one kicks, a career-high, and had 729 yards for a NCAA Division I-AA single season record with a 34.7-yard return average, plus record tying two touchdowns (103- and 101-yard runbacks.) Craig was selected by Eastern Washington University to its All-Purpose/Specialist *100 for 100 of All-Time Team* in 2008.

Craig was drafted in the 11th round (298th pick overall) by the Kansas City Chiefs in the 1987 NFL Draft, was released at end of training camp, was picked-up off waivers, and signed a contract with Los Angeles, playing one season with the Rams. Also, the following year, he had a tryout with Calgary Stampeders of the CFL.

Andrew Carroll '95

Andrew Carroll is a proud member of the O'Dea class of 1995, and a graduate of the University of Washington.

During his high school career, Andrew was a 3-year varsity letterman and is a member of the 1995 State Champion Track & Field team. Andrew was the State runner up in the 300M hurdles and placed 4th in Washington State in the 110M hurdles. He was a captain of the 1994 State Champion Football Team and was a Metro Champion in the hurdles.

Andrew currently holds O'Dea records in the 300M (38.0) hurdles and shares the record in the 110M hurdles (14.2). Andrew went on to play football at the University of Washington, where he lettered 3 years.

Anthony Felder '05

Anthony Felder is a member of the O'Dea class of 2005, and a graduate of the University of California, Berkeley. While at O'Dea, Anthony was a 3-year varsity letterman, and co-captain of the football team where he played linebacker and fullback.

He was 2nd Team All-Metro at linebacker as a sophomore, 1st Team All-Metro at linebacker, and 2nd Team All-Metro at running back as a junior, Metro League Defensive Co-MVP as a junior, 1st Team All-Metro at linebacker and running back as a senior, and Metro League Defensive MVP as a senior. Anthony was named to the All-State football team at linebacker as a senior and graduated as O'Dea's all-time career leading tackler.

Anthony received an athletic scholarship to the University of California, Berkeley and was named Freshman All-American 1st team by rivals.com. He was a 4-year letterman, 3-year starter at linebacker, competed in 4 bowl games, was a member of the 2006 PAC-10 Co-Championship team, and earned PAC-10 All Conference Honorable Mention as a junior and senior. He was selected to play in the 2009 East West Shine All-Star Game.

1995 State Championship Track Team

In 1995, the O'Dea Track Team competed in the Lincoln Bowl in Tacoma. On that day, with a total of 60 points, outperforming the second-place team by 19 points, O'Dea brought home the State Championship trophy. Matt Pearson came in 1st in the 800M and 4th in the 1600M. David Bazzi came in 8th in the 1600M, and 5th in the 3200M. In the 400 Relay, O'Dea came in 5th. Andrew Carroll came in 4th in the 110M high hurdles, and 2nd in the 300M intermediate hurdles, with Chris Johnson coming in 5th. Kurth Connell garnered a win in the shot put and came in 3rd in discuss. Josh Lukaymuzi secured 6th in the triple jump. A true team effort to bring home this state championship win!
