

EDUCATION FOR ALL LEARNERS

O'Dea prides itself on its commitment to meet students where they are in their academic journey, tailoring an approach that empowers each of them to their next level of success. Whether it's providing support for students with learning differences or challenging those who seek to transcend traditional high school curriculum, O'Dea cultivates a dynamic educational environment that fosters growth for all young men. Below are examples of two programs that help our students reach their full potential.

BUILDING SUCCESS & INDIVIDUALIZED GROWTH

One of our primary initiatives is to increase the range of student learning styles we can support at O'Dea through our Educational Support Program.

Led by Angie Gebhart (HNA Class of 2008), our Educational Support Program provides instruction and assistance to students with documented learning differences. Students are supported in reaching their goals and becoming independent learners with an individualized educational support plan. Services include offering classroom support, tutoring, and executive functioning instruction. To enhance our support for this diverse group of learners, we have increased our team to four full-time staff members — Angie, Jackson Derby, Pierre LeDorze 2013, and Rebecca McPharlin (mother of Joshua '99 and Jacob 2001). These incredible faculty members ensure that all students in the program are provided with the tools they need to succeed in the classroom and thrive as independent learners.

The program's primary aim is to identify where students are academically, create goals with them, and work together to find the best types of support that will help bridge the gap for a successful career at O'Dea and beyond. The team works closely with families and faculty members to align available accommodations and maximize student outcomes, while teaching students to advocate for themselves and their learning. We also rely on our 1:1 Surface program, utilizing many accessibility tools to provide growth opportunities for all students.

As we look to expand the program, we will continue to utilize innovative ways to help our students grow and realize their full potential. "O'Dea's Educational Support Program was key to supporting our son with ADHD. The teachers in the program quickly earned his trust and taught him strategies for homework and test taking, allowing him to truly excel in subjects where he previously struggled." - Class of 2027 Parent

SEATTLE UNIVERSITY & O'DEA CONTINUE PARTNERSHIP

O'Dea continues to expand its long-standing partnership with Seattle University's Matteo Ricci Institute to offer college courses in our classrooms. Courses offered include English Honors, Difference, Power, and Social Change, and Calculus. We are currently exploring an expansion into world languages and lab sciences in the near future.

Through this program, our faculty work directly with a mentor at Seattle University (SU). Our students have access to the full SU digital library of resources. Due to our proximity to SU's campus, we also have the chance to engage in unique learning opportunities in their state-of-the-art facilities. We are grateful to SU for providing incredible financial support to our students already receiving needbased financial aid at O'Dea, making the Matteo Ricci program more accessible. We look forward to a continued partnership with SU and helping our students advance their future education.

PETER BACHO '68

Peter is an educator, renowned novelist, and short story writer. He has been honored with many awards including the American Book Award, Washington State Governor's Writers Award, and the Murray Morgan Prize. His most recent book, *Uncle Rico's Encore*, is a collection of autobiographical essays that pays tribute to Filipino Seattle. The essays speak to Peter's life growing up in Seattle's multi-ethnic neighborhoods, including his years at O'Dea.



VERY REVEREND MICHAEL G. RYAN

Fr. Ryan, pastor at St. James Cathedral for more than 35 years, and honorary graduate of O'Dea, creates a welcoming world with his sensitivity and compassion, love of family, and voice for those in need. Fr. Ryan has formed a strong partnership with O'Dea, providing opportunities for our students to serve in the Cathedral Garden and Kitchen. He is a strong advocate, religious leader, and friend, continually helping O'Dea remain grounded in faith and confident in our future.

Fr. Tim is a longtime pastor, community advocate, and leader, whose compassionate work has had a profound impact on generations of people throughout the Archdiocese of Seattle. This work, and his continued involvement, has provided invaluable guidance to the young men of O'Dea.

STUDENT LIFE

O'DEA eSPORTS: MORE THAN JUST VIDEO GAMES



The O'Dea eSports team, led by **Xavier Patajo '24**, captain, and Paul Marenco, eSports Moderator, provides a supportive community for students to grow in critical areas of life.

While the main activity of esports is to compete in video games, the overarching goal of O'Dea eSports extends beyond the game. Its goal is to create well-rounded individuals who can communicate effectively, work collaboratively as a team, and strive for success in all aspects of life. The team provides various roles beyond playing video games, such as commentating, graphic designing, stream managing, and montage editing. This not only makes the eSports experience more dynamic but also allows students to explore and contribute to the team in ways that align with their interests and skills.

Over the years, O'Dea eSports has witnessed remarkable growth. Since Xavier joined as a freshman, the team has doubled its member count and expanded its game offerings. The team's success has also led it to become an official House Games activity.

Highlighting the benefits of participating in eSports, Xavier underscores the parallels with traditional sports in terms of teamwork, practice, and commitment. There is even an opportunity to earn college scholarships from eSports.

As a longtime participant in O'Dea eSports, Xavier has had memorable experiences and lessons. He emphasizes the importance of teaching underclassman camaraderie, wisdom, and leadership; characteristics that will impact members throughout their entire lives.

CATHOLIC LIFESAVER CORPS

Four O'Dea students, Nick Burroughs '24, Zach Dieteker '24, Carter Gribble '24 and Benjamin Valladares '24, have been active participants in the Archdiocesan Catholic Lifesaver Corps (CLC) program. CLC is a unique peer-to-peer suicide prevention program that certifies high school students as facilitators of safeTALK, a four-hour suicide prevention workshop. These students then offer regular trainings in their respective schools and nearby parishes to educate fellow students on the signs of suicidal ideation and the necessary steps to keep their peers safe. O'Dea is proud to acknowledge our four CLC members who have trained 40 O'Dea students and parents, 50 students at a Confirmation workshop, and the O'Dea



faculty and staff. The O'Dea group of CLC facilitators is the most active group in the Archdiocese, having trained the most students of any other group.

SCHOOL SERVICE DAY

On the last day of school before Christmas break students, faculty, and staff had the opportunity to give back to the community by cleaning our First Hill neighborhood, making sandwiches for homeless people served at St. James' Cathedral Kitchen, and wrapping presents contributed by students, faculty, and staff for families who needed support at Christmas.



ACTION LEADERSHIP WORKSHOP

Davonn Abaga '25, Dylan Smith '25, and Ryan Toomey '25, along with Will Chambers, O'Dea faculty member, traveled to the ACTION Leadership Workshop in New Jersey to grow as student leaders. They were joined by other Edmund Rice Christian Brother School students from 5 countries. Together, they attended workshops focusing on service and advocacy for those in need and completed projects focusing on social justice.



GIVING BACK TO THE COMMUNITY OF BROWNSVILLE

Quinn will be attending Colorado College this fall and plans to study business and play on the lacrosse team.



Dear O'Dea Community,

For nearly seven years, I've had the privilege of working close to our community to raise vital funds for O'Dea. Seeing our community embrace philanthropy and come together to support this great school has been inspiring and has propelled our fundraising program to new levels. Your consistent support helped establish the fun and successful Give Gold Day—a day of giving dedication specifically to

O'Dea. In addition, we continue to honor our traditional fundraising events such as our Annual Auction, now in its 53rd year. This is a true testament to how much our community values the continuation of O'Dea's legacy. Through your collective efforts, you've shown all of us the true spirit of character, faith, and service, which defines O'Dea.

While fundraising supports, and enhances, many elements of the O'Dea experience, one area we consistently discuss is financial aid. When I started at O'Dea in 2016, we were providing \$1.2 million of aid to 32% of our families. This year, we are providing \$2 million in need-based aid to over 40% of our families. To support this increase, the Advancement Team has enhanced our focus on raising money through an endowment for financial aid.

Increasing this endowment ensures financial stability and the longevity of O'Dea. It also allows O'Dea to direct more of its operational budget toward other vital needs, such as faculty and staff recruitment and retention.

Many people who give to an endowment have chosen to do so in the name of someone they love or respect. In the last seven years the number of these endowments has grown from 9 to 44. Listed below are the named endowments that support our students. **Time after time, we come to you for help, and as a community you always show up.** For this and all you do to support O'Dea, I, and the entire Advancement Team, thank you.




